*To be shown in hand at the walk and trot on the triangle. Judged for suitability to become dressage horses. To be scored 60% movement, 30% conformation, 10% general impression. Bridles are mandatory for horses two-years-old and older. See Breed Show Directive #2.*

112. Young Horse Championship- first three places from classes 109 & 110. Foals of current year are ineligible for this class. (no fee)

### **MATURE HORSE/BREEDING CLASSES**

*To be shown in hand at the walk and trot on the triangle. Judged for suitability to produce dressage horses. To be scored 50% movement, 40% conformation, 10% general impression.*

113. Four year old and older Maiden\* (never bred) Mares
114. Four year old and older Broodmares\* (in foal or nursing), mare only to be judged
115. Four year old and older Yeld Mares\* (not currently bred or nursing)
116. Four year old and older Stallions being shown *only in hand* at D.A.D. (may not enter classes 127, 130, 131, 132, 140 or any class in the performance division )
117. Four-year-old and Older Stallions also showing under saddle at D.A.D. (must show in at least one of classes 127, 130, 131, 132, 140 or in the performance division)
118. Mare Championship - first two places from classes 113, 114 & 115 to be judged (no fee) Great American Insurance Group/USDFBC Qualifier
119. Stallion Championship - first two places from classes 116 and 117 to be judged (no fee) Great American Insurance Group/USDFBC Qualifier
120. Mature Horse Championship - Champion and Reserve from classes 118 and 119 to be judged (no fee)
121. Grand Championship - Champion and Reserve from classes 112, & 120 to be judged (no fee)

- Mares breeding status as of January 1, 2010. Exception: During the calendar year in which an embryo transfer recipient mare is due to foal, the embryo transfer donor mare must compete according to her breeding status the year prior to being bred. DR203.16

### **HANDLER CLASSES**

**Every adult amateur competitor must present a USEF Amateur Card or sign an Amateur application and pay the appropriate fee.**

122. Adult Amateur Handler – To be shown in hand by an Amateur who is the owner or a member of the owner's family, no leased or borrowed horses permitted. To be judged on presentation of the animal to the judge, neatness and appearance of the handler and the overall condition of the animal. This class is intended to stimulate participation of the Amateur in the Breeding division and does not limit that person to this class. No stallions or colts except weanlings.
123. Jr./Young Rider Handler – to be shown in hand by a Junior or Young Rider according to the directives of class 122.

### **NON-CHAMPIONSHIP GROUP CLASSES**

*Classes below to be shown in hand. To move at the judges' discretion not necessarily on the triangle. To be judged on overall quality of movement, conformation and general impressions of entry. Entry fee per group, not per horse. Entries in Produce of Dam and Get of Sire must be made by the owner of the dam or sire, or with written permission from the owner, in the name of that dam or sire. To be scored 50% movement, 40% conformation, 10% general impression. Horses entered in group classes are not required to have shown in individual in-hand classes. See Art.DR204.2b*

**\*Note: A separate entry form must be used for group classes. Place Dam (class 124), Sire (class 125), or Breeder (class 126) name in the 'Name of Horse' section of the entry form and name the horses that will be judged in the 'Class Description' section of the entry form. Horse owners must be listed for each horse in the group. Each horse entered in a group class must have an individual entry form completed and on file with the show secretary, even if the horse is not competing in other classes.**

124. Produce of Dam (Dam not judged) - two or three produce of the same dam entered under dam's name. Multiple ownership permitted. Limited to two groups. All produce to be listed by name on mare's entry form along with the owners.
125. Get of Sire (Sire not present) - two or three get of the same sire entered under the sire's name. Multiple ownership permitted. Limited to two groups. All get to be listed by name on sire's entry form along with the owners.
126. Breeder's Group - group of no more than three horses of any age or sex all bred by the exhibitor and entered under the exhibitor's name. Limited to two groups. Multiple ownership permitted, owners must be listed.

### **UNDER SADDLE CLASSES**

*To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. To be judged 60% movement, 30% conformation, 10% general impression including impulsion, balance and rideability. Horses must be at least 36 months of age. Horses in under saddle classes are no longer required to have shown in individual in-hand classes. See Art. DR204.2d. Dress must conform to DR120, and for Under Saddle classes, Saddlery and Equipment must conform to DR121, except that all horses using a bridle are required to compete in a snaffle pictured in Chapter DR, Subchapter DR-1, Figure 1A.*

127. Four-year-old and older Mares under Saddle
128. Four-year-old and older Stallions under Saddle
129. Suitable to become a Dressage Horse - open to horses three years old not competing above First Level. To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. To be judged on the horse's potential to become a Dressage mount. Horses are placed and no actual scores are awarded.
130. Suitable to become a Dressage Horse - open to horses four years old, as above for class 127.
131. Suitable to become a Dressage Horse - open to horses five years old as above for class 127.
132. Suitable to become a Dressage Horse - open to six year old horses as above for class 127.

### **GREAT AMERICAN INSURANCE GROUP/USDF BREEDERS CHAMPIONSHIP FINAL - EAST COAST SERIES**

*In order to compete in Classes 133–137 horses must be Lifetime Registered with the USDF and the owner must be a USDF Participating or Business member. Verification of membership and horse registration must be provided to show management **prior** to competing in a Series Final class. At least two judges will evaluate each entry independently. Winners will be determined by the averaged score. Horses will be shown individually on the triangle at the walk and trot and standing for conformation. Late entries are permitted for these classes. Additional shows may become qualifiers. **Classes 133, 134, 135 will be held Tuesday afternoon/evening, September 28. Classes 136, 137 will be held Wednesday afternoon/evening, September 29.***

Great American Insurance Group/USDF Filly Champion - The Filly Champion and Reserve and any horse scoring 77% or better from VADA/NOVA Summer Breed Shows I & II, Dressage at Lexington, Fair Hill Dressage Sport Horse Breed Shows I & II, Dressage at Stone Tavern, NCDCTA Sport Horse Breeding Show, and Dressage at Devon will compete to determine the overall Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion of the series.
134. Great American Insurance Group/USDF Colt Champion - The Colt Champion and Reserve from the shows listed in Class 133 will compete to determine the overall Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion of the series.
135. Great American Insurance Group/USDF Foal Champion – The Foal Champion and Reserve from the shows listed in Class 133 will compete to determine the overall Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion of the series.
136. Great American Insurance Group/USDF Mare Champion - The Mare Champion and Reserve from the shows listed in Class 133 will compete to determine the overall Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion of the series.
137. Great American Insurance Group/USDF Stallion Champion - The Stallion Champion and Reserve from the shows listed in Class 133 will compete to determine the overall Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion of the series.

### Material Classes

*Horses will be evaluated according to the criteria listed on the USDF Materiale Class Scoresheet and classes will be conducted according to the USDF "Procedures to Host USDF Materiale Classes". Horses will be evaluated under saddle at the walk, trot and canter in both directions of the arena. No more than six horses will be asked to canter at one time. Four and five year old horses may be asked to lengthen the stride at the trot and canter. Horses must be at least 36 months of age to participate in Materiale Classes. Materiale classes may not be divided to allow one rider to ride more than one horse. Dress must conform to DR120, and for Under Saddle classes, Saddlery and Equipment must conform to DR121, except that all horses using a bridle are required to compete in a snaffle pictured in Chapter DR, Subchapter DR-1, Figure 1A.*

### INDIVIDUAL BREED CLASSES (IBC)

All classes listed below are for horses registered with the sponsoring breed organization and owners must be members in good standing of that organization, unless otherwise noted. Open to horses of all ages and scored 60% movement, 30% conformation, 10% general impression. 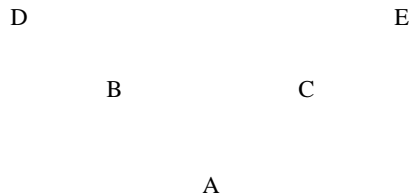

### CLASS PROCEDURE

- All competitors are responsible for understanding and complying with the USEF Dressage/Sport Horse Breeding rules on pages DR201-DR211 (pages DR45-DR50) of the 2010 USEF Rule Book.
- Any horse entering the arena, whether being judged or not, must be controlled by a separate handler or assistant handler. NO HORSE, INCLUDING FOALS, MAY BE SHOWN LOOSE.
- All horses must be under the control of a separate handler. One horse, one handler at all times.
- In classes with 20 or more entries the horses with the top scores may be recalled as a group for re-evaluation in compliance with USEF Rule DR209.1.c.
- Championship Class Procedure - Horses will be shown at the walk as a group and individually at the trot.

The triangle measures approximately 30 meters on each side. When called by the Ringmaster, present your horse to the Judge at "A" for conformation judging. Upon direction, follow the procedure as diagrammed below:



- Stand horse at "A" for conformation judging
- Walk small triangle - A - B - C - A
- Trot large triangle - A - D - E - A
- Leave judging area promptly unless requested to do otherwise by the judge

### BREED DIVISION DIRECTIVES

1. **Arrival: No horse will be admitted to grounds before noon, Monday, September 27, 2010.**
2. **Equipment and Turnout:** In accordance with USEF Dressage Sport Horse Breeding Rules Article DR206.
3. **Protective Head Gear:** The Horse Show Committee strongly encourages everyone to wear approved protective head gear when mounted.
4. All horses (whether competing or non-competing) must wear bridle numbers at all times while being ridden or exercised, including being hand-walked.
5. **Handlers:** Any person who holds, walks or trots a horse while it is being judged in the competition arena for any In-Hand, Group or Championship class. Handlers may have one Assistant Handler, if necessary. The handler, assistant handler and/or a whip assistant may each carry only one whip, or one standard lungeing whip (without attachments, i.e. plastic bags, etc.). In addition disruptive noisemaking devices are not permitted in the competition ring or warm-up areas. Prior to entering the competition arena all Handlers and Assistant Handlers must have on file, in the Show Secretary's office, a Handler/Assistant Release Form and be wearing an appropriate wrist band. Handlers must be USEF members or pay the non-member fee.
6. **Assistant Handler:** Any person, other than the Handler, who holds or walks a horse in the competition arena during a class, whether or not it is being judged. An Assistant Handler is permitted only for call-backs after In-Hand or Group classes, for Championships and for handling non-competing mares and foals which accompany another entry in the competition arena. Assistant Handlers may not show a horse at the trot, (except for horses not being judged but accompanying a mare or foal that is being judged), and if not Federation members, are exempted from the USEF non-member fee, but are otherwise subject to all rules regarding Handlers. Only Handlers and Assistant Handlers may act as Whip Assistants.
7. Unauthorized Assistance by individuals outside the competition ring is not permitted. (DR207.10)  
Management reserves the right to disqualify any competitor receiving unauthorized assistance.
8. Handlers with multiple entries in two rings must resolve scheduling conflicts. The Committee reserves the right to keep the show on schedule and enforce the order of go.
9. **Behavior:** A judge must excuse from the ring any unruly horse or one whose actions threaten to endanger handlers, officials, other exhibitors or their entries (USEF Rule DR207.1). The organizing committee reserves the right to excuse from the grounds any horse whose actions threaten to endanger other exhibitors, their entries or spectators.
10. **Awards:** Persons presenting horses for awards **MUST** be suitably attired to appear before an audience.
  - Trophy and ten ribbons per class. If classes are divided, duplicate ribbons will be awarded. Ties will be broken by the movement score; if same, then by the judge. The highest scoring horse will receive the trophy.
  - Champion and Reserve ribbons will be awarded in all Championship classes.  
Prize money for classes 109, 110, 111, 118, 119, and 121 may be picked up in the show secretary's office with proper identification. Champion \$600 and Reserve Champion \$400.
11. **Entries:** Completed entries are to be mailed to the Breed Show Secretary and must be **RECEIVED** by the closing date. **INCOMPLETE ENTRIES WILL NOT BE PROCESSED. THEY WILL BE HELD AND THE OWNER NOTIFIED OF THE MISSING ELEMENTS. THESE ENTRIES WILL NOT BE PROCESSED UNTIL ALL NECESSARY INFORMATION IS PRESENT. IF THAT INFORMATION DOES NOT ARRIVE PRIOR TO THE CLOSING DATE, THE ENTRY WILL BE CONSIDERED A POST ENTRY. THE ONLY EXCEPTION TO THIS WILL BE USDF AND USEF NON-MEMBER/MEMBERSHIP AFFIDAVIT FORMS AND USDF OR USEF HORSE IDENTIFICATION NUMBERS ON FOALS BORN AFTER JUNE 1, 2010.** Entries received after the closing date will be considered post entries and will be **accepted only if scheduling permits** at **double** the class fee with the exception of classes 133 to 137. **NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER**

SEPTEMBER 18, 2010 even in cases of scratches. If entries are sent by express or over night mail **you must sign the signature waiver** before mailing. This enables your entry to be delivered without being signed for at its destination. **The secretary will NOT pick up express mail that needs signature. It will be returned. No telephone or fax entries will be accepted.** **If entries are accepted after the closing date they may not be included in the show program. Confirmations will be sent to the owner.**

All entries must be typed or printed on Dressage at Devon Entry Forms and must include:

- **Photocopy of USEF proof of membership for owner, trainer, and rider and/ or handler, coach (if applicable), and agent (if applicable), MUST accompany entry form.**
- **Photocopy of USDF proof of membership for owner, and rider MUST accompany entry form.**
- **Photocopies of Horses USDF ID number or lifetime registration and USEF ID number (if applicable) MUST accompany entry form.**
- **Photocopy of horse's breed registration if entered in an individual breed class**
- Original Handwritten Signatures - Owner, Trainer, Rider and/or Handler, and Coach (if applicable).
- **Assistants Handlers must sign the Assistant Handler Release Form.**
- Complete information as required on both sides of the Entry Form.
- Photocopy of negative Coggins Test dated September 27, 2009 or later.
- Check or money order made payable to DAD Breed Division
- Breeder's Group Entries: Please list Exhibitor's (Breeder's) name in the space provided for Name of Horse and list information for all horses to be shown in the class under "Class Description" including names of owners if multiple ownership.
- Any documentation such as negative EIA certificate that is required for entry to a competition must list the same horse name and description as is listed on the entry blank and on the USEF horse identification or recording documents. (GR 907.3)

#### **Membership requirements:**

In order to show in the open classes every horse must have a USDF HID or lifetime registration number. Every owner/lessee must have a USDF (participating, group or intercollegiate/interscholastic) membership or USDF non-member number and pay the USDF non member fee. Handlers, owner/lessees, trainers and coaches, agents also must have a USEF membership or pay a non-member fee, and must pay USEF dressage discipline dues or fees. Platinum and Life members do not pay the discipline fee. Junior members and non-members are exempt from the requirement to pay discipline dues or fees.

In order to show ONLY in IBC classes, every horse must have a USEF HID or horse recording number or USDF HID or lifetime registration. Every handler, owner/lessee, trainer and coach must be a USEF member or pay the USEF non-member fee, and must pay USEF dressage discipline dues or fees. Individual Breed classes (IBCs) in a DSHB competition are exempt from the USDF HID or Lifetime registration requirement.

12. **Stabling** Careful attention is given to assignment of horse and tack stalls. **Anyone found changing or using stalls without the prior permission of the Stabling Office will be assessed a \$100 fine per stall. ANYTHING placed in a stall is considered "using" the stall. Sharps containers are provided in the barn areas. There is to be NO SMOKING in or around the barns.**

13. **Fees:** All fees to be in U.S. funds. Non-negotiable checks incur a \$50 charge.

#### **Conduct of Great American Insurance Group/USDF-BC Series Finals Classes**

1. **At least two judges** (one of whom must be a licensed USEF DSHB judge) **must officiate in each Series Final class. Each judge will evaluate each entry independently, and scribes must be provided for each judge.** Winners will be determined by the average of all judges' scores. The highest scoring horses will be declared champions and the second highest will be declared reserve champions.

2. Filly Champions and Reserves and any horse with a score of 77% or better from each Qualifying Event will compete together in the Great American Insurance Group/USDFBC Filly Final class. Colt/Gelding Champions and Reserves and any horse with a score of 77% from each Qualifying Event will compete together in the Great American Insurance Group/USDFBC Colt/Gelding Final class. Foal Champions and Reserves and any foal with a score of 77% from each Qualifying Event will compete together in the Great American Insurance Group/USDFBC Foal Final class. Mare Champions and Reserves and any horse with a score of 77% from each Qualifying Event will compete together in the Great American Insurance Group/USDFBC Mare Final class. Stallion Champions and Reserves and any horse with a score of 77% from each Qualifying Event will compete together in the Great American Insurance Group/USDFBC Stallion Final class. Please note the following clarification on "Stallion": No geldings may compete in the USDFBC classes for stallions even if they are gelded after qualifying for the finals and are breeding via frozen semen.
3. A Champion and Reserve Filly, a Champion and Reserve Colt/Gelding, a Champion and Reserve Foal, a Champion and Reserve Mare and a Champion and Reserve Stallion will be named at each Series Final Event. Champions will receive a neck sash, cooler and prize. Reserve Champions will receive a neck sash and prize. Neck sashes and prizes will be provided by USDF. Third through sixth placed horses in Final classes will receive ribbons provided by USDF. After the Final Event, special certificates will be available on line at [www.usdf.org](http://www.usdf.org) for owners of all horses that compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDFBC Series Finals classes.
4. Horses must be shown individually on the triangle at the walk and trot and standing for conformation. Each horse must be evaluated in the same manner. Callbacks are permitted. If horses may be recalled, the prize list or program must state that this procedure will be used. (DR 209.1.c)

#### Special Breed Show Awards

Born in the USA Breeders Awards – These awards will go to the high scoring horses who were conceived and born in the USA showing in the following categories: Fillies of 2010, Colts of 2010, Yearling fillies, Yearling Colts/Geldings, 2 year old Fillies, 2 year old Colts/Geldings, 3 year old Fillies, 3 year old Colts/Geldings, Mares, Stallions, 3 year old Filly Materiale, Three year old Colt/Gelding Materiale, 4/5 Mare Materiale, 4/5 year old Stallion/Gelding Materiale. Prize money will be awarded in each category and give 75% to owner and 25% to the breeder of the winning horses. In addition to prize money, all winners will receive "Born in the USA" rosettes. Additional prize money will be given to the two highest scoring horses overall. **Horses must have placed in the top 50% of their class to receive these awards.**

Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions; 8) Opportunity classes. 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes. Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

#### **USEF Rule Restricting Operation of Motorized Vehicles**

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooter, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of recognized competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Classes 13- 25 will be conducted under FEI regulations (Art. 422). All horses in these classes must have FEI Passports (exception, Young Riders, see below). Classes 13 through 25 are open, except the Freestyles (Classes 15, 19) and the Special (Class 17), and are limited to horse/rider combinations that have submitted two scores, dated September 15, 2009, or later, for each level entered. The scores must have been at, or above, the level entered, and have been received from two different judges at two different USEF, or other NF, licensed shows. The "Qualification Statement" on the entry form must be completed for each entry. On closing day, August 18, 2010, the entries with the highest averaged scores will be placed in classes until the classes are filled and all other entries will be wait listed. Entries received after the closing date with higher qualifying scores will NOT be given preference over entries received by the closing date. Fees will be deposited when entries are accepted in a class. Classes 20, 21, and 22 are conducted under FEI Art. J-5. Classes 23, 24, and 25 are conducted under FEI Art. YR-6.

Horse/rider combinations that have previously represented their country in FEI Championships are exempt from submitting qualifying scores to enter classes at Dressage at Devon, at the same level as they competed in an FEI Championship, for which they are otherwise eligible. Proof of eligibility must be submitted upon request.

**2010 Intermediaire 1/Grand Prix Pro-Am Challenge** – Teams consisting of one Professional and one Amateur riding in either Intermediaire 1 Freestyle (class 15) and/or Grand Prix Freestyle (class 19) will have their percentage scores totaled and the top scoring team will be awarded the 2010 Pro Am Championship. The second highest scoring team will be awarded the 2010 Pro-Am Reserve Championship. Secretary must be informed of your team by noon Saturday October 2.

## SPECIAL INFORMATION FOR FEI COMPETITORS

This event is organized in accordance with: FEI Statutes (22nd edition, effective 15th April 2007), updated 21 November 2008, General Regulations (23rd edition, effective 1st January 2009), Veterinary Regulations (12th edition, effective 5th April 2010), the Rules for Dressage Events (23rd edition effective 1st January 2009), and if applicable the Rules for the World Cup Dressage Events. Special Regulations for Young Rider Dressage Events (9<sup>th</sup> edition effective 1<sup>st</sup> January 2009). All subsequent corrections and modifications to the above Rules and Regulations as published by the FEI. All FEI rules and regulations will be strictly enforced.

An arbitration procedure is provided for in the FEI Statutes and General Regulations referred to above. In accordance with this procedure, any appeal against a decision rendered by the FEI or its official bodies is to be settled exclusively by the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS) in Lausanne, Switzerland. It is the responsibility of NFs to ensure their participants are of the correct age, and that riders and horses are registered with the FEI.

**Foreign Federations:** The following foreign federations have been invited to attend: ARG, AUS, CAN, COL, CRC, DEN, FRA, GBR, GER, MEX, NED, PUR, ROM, SWE, SUI. A maximum of twenty riders per foreign federation and no more than four horses per rider may participate. Competitors are invited by the Organizing Committee (OC) through their NF. One groom per rider. In order to compete all riders, except foreign riders invited thru their NFs, will be required to meet the qualifying scores listed in the prize list. On closing day, September 15, 2010, the entries with the highest qualifying scores will be placed in classes until the classes are filled and all other entries will wait listed and put into a class as openings become available.

**Rider Eligibility:** Competitors must have reached or will reach their 16th birthday in 2010 (ex. Junior Riders) and must be licensed by their National Federation and may only take part under the jurisdiction of the NF of the country from which they hold their passport. If not of U.S. citizenship, they must be nominated by an invited foreign NF. Riders must be prepared to produce their license or USEF membership card on request of the Organizing Committee, and the name on the entry must be the same as appears on the license. All Riders in the CDI must pay \$35.00 for IHP Discipline Fee. All riders must present evidence of FEI Rider and Horse Registration in order to participate.

**Horse Eligibility:** Horses must be a minimum of seven years of age (8 years for Grand Prix and six years for the JR and YR tests) and must exceed 149 cm including shoes. Mares may not compete after their fourth month of pregnancy or within nine months after foaling date. The nationality of a horse is that of its owner or of the country in which the company owning it is registered. \*Each horse must have an official FEI Passport. **The horse's passport must be presented to the show secretary immediately upon arrival on the show grounds Thursday morning.** USEF will provide information on veterinary requirements for foreign horses entering the USA. Horses must be stabled on the grounds and may not leave during the event (commencing with the Veterinary Inspection and ending with the pinning of their final FEI class). Each horse will keep the same number throughout the event. It is compulsory for this number to be worn by the horse, competitor or handler at all times, when the horse is being handled, exercised, or shown on the grounds so that it may be identified by the stewards.

\*The requirement to have an FEI passport is waived, for CDIY/CDIJ horses competing in their home country. However, these horses must be registered with their NF, have a proper identification document (including FEI-type diagram), and have a valid vaccination certificate (see Vaccination information). The USEF National Passport meets these requirements. Contact the USEF International Department @ (859) 258-2472 for more information. Proof of FEI Registration for all CDI-W/Y/J horses must be submitted in order to participate.

**Awards:** Awards will be distributed to 25% of participants in each competition. Prize money may be picked up at the secretary's office when competitors pick up their passports provided that there are no outstanding obligations to the committee or any supplier. Riders are to appear formally attired and mounted for all award ceremonies. Failure to do so will eliminate the official score and placing and the next highest score will move up in placing. Out of courtesy for sponsors, spectators and management, competitors must adhere to the times for Awards Ceremonies. Award ceremony times will be strictly adhered to. Lateness might entail elimination of a competitor from the class.

**Arenas:** Competitions will take place outdoors in 20M X 60M sand mix footing arenas. Warm-up will be in 20M X 60M sand mix ring.

**Expenses:** The Organizing Committee is not responsible for any expenses of competitors, horses, owners, their employees or agents, and does not offer expense allowances or reimbursements.

**Stable Access:** Only properly identified riders, trainers, grooms, farriers, treating veterinarians, officials, organizing committee members and two owners per horse will be allowed to enter the stable area. Wristbands will be used for identification. **Horses not entered in the CDI may be stabled in this area only if space permits. Owners/Riders must provide health certificates, negative Coggins and vaccination records in compliance with FEI regulations and signed by a veterinarian for these horses with their entry form. When a group is designating a "stable with" preference, please designate just one person to be named on the stable form. "Stable with" preferences are NOT GUARANTEED. There is to be NO SMOKING in or around the barns. Sharps containers are provided in the barn areas.**

**CDI competitors must be checked in with the show office and have turned their passports over by Thursday September 30 at 8:00AM. Horses must be in their stalls by 8:00 AM Thursday September 30.**

**Logos:** Competitors may carry only the logo of their personal sponsor on each side of their saddle cloth. It must not exceed 200 sq. cm.

**Tack check:** A steward will check the saddlery of each horse immediately after the horse leaves the competition arena. Any discrepancy will entail immediate elimination. All exercise/warmup areas and arenas will be supervised.

**Objections:** All complaints, in order to be valid, must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit equivalent of 150 Swiss Francs.

**Organizers Rights:** The Organizing Committee retains the right to split, cancel, or change the day of a class or to further restrict the number of horses a rider may ride in any one class, also to cancel the event under special circumstances with the permission of the USEF and the FEI, and return entry fees.

**Starting Order:** A drawing will be conducted each day to determine the order of starting for each class. The draw for Friday's Grand Prix, Prix St. Georges and Junior and Young Rider classes will immediately follow the Veterinary Inspection on Thursday in a designated place. The start order for the Grand Prix for the Freestyle will be in the reverse order of the World Dressage Ranking List in groups of five. The starting order for the Grand Prix for the Special will be a straight draw. The starting order for the Grand Prix Musical Freestyle will be as follows: The rider/horse combinations are divided into groups of five with the group of riders placed 11-15 in the Grand Prix qualifier for the Freestyle to start first and the best five in the last group. The starting order within these groups will be determined by draw. The starting order for the Grand Prix Special will be as follows: A draw will be held within groups of five, in reverse order of the result of the Grand Prix qualifier for the Special, with the group of riders placed 11-15 to start first and the best group of five to start last. Draws on Friday and Saturday will be held in a designated place to be announced. A draw order cannot be changed. Once entered in a class, a rider may not withdraw, except as specified in the FEI rules. FEI rules provide for penalties for scratches without good cause.

**Intermediaire I Musical Freestyle:** Participation for riders entered in the Intermediaire I freestyle is open to and compulsory for up to the 15 best combinations from the Prix St. Georges or Intermediaire I competition who earned a minimum of 58%. The athlete/horse combinations qualified from Prix St. Georges shall be drawn before athletes qualified from the Intermediaire.

**Young Rider Musical Freestyle:** Participation is optional and open to the 15 best horse/rider combinations from Class 23, the FEI Young Rider Prix St. Georges, who earned a minimum score of 58%. A rider may start only one horse and participation is compulsory for riders who entered the class and qualified to ride.

**Grand Prix Qualifier for the Freestyle:** Riders entering more than one horse must declare which horse (1) that they intend to qualify with for the FEI World Cup Dressage qualifier-GP Freestyle.

**Grand Prix Freestyle:** Riders intending to compete for United States Grand Prix Freestyle Championships (USFC) Qualification must enter the Grand Prix and the Grand Prix Musical Freestyle (USFC Qualifier). Participation in the Freestyle is limited to and compulsory for, up to the 15 best rider/horse combinations who entered the Grand Prix Qualifier for the Grand Prix Freestyle and earned a minimum score of 58%. Qualified riders are obliged to start in the Freestyle or loose their placing in the Grand Prix Qualifier for the Grand Prix Freestyle. Should a competitor not qualify for the Freestyle, their entry fee will be refunded. A rider may start only one horse in the Grand Prix Qualifier for the Grand Prix Musical Freestyle (Class 17) and in the Grand Prix Freestyle (Class 18).

**Grand Prix Special:** Participation in the Grand Prix Special is limited to, and compulsory for, up to the 15 best rider/horse combinations who entered the Grand Prix Qualifier for the GP Special (Class 15). Riders are obliged to start in the Grand Prix Special if qualified by their placing in the Grand Prix Qualifier for the GP Special. Should a competitor not qualify for the Special, their entry fee will be refunded. A rider may start only one horse in the Grand Prix Special.

Note: Class 15, is the qualifier for the Grand Prix Special and Class 18 is the qualifier for the GP Freestyle.

**Veterinary Examinations, Inspections and Passport Controls:** These will be carried out in accordance with "Veterinary Regulation". Art. 1011 and the discipline rules. General Regulations 23rd edition, effective 1st January 2009 will apply.

Art. 139.1, every horse entered for any competition at CNs, or CIMs (see Appendix D) in a foreign country (See GR 141.2), and all horses entered for CIs, CIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries (see GR 141.2), must have an official valid FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card, and, when applicable, an FEI registration number, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

In accordance with Art. 139.2, horses taking part in CNs, CIMs (see appendix D) in their country of residence are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered, and identifiable by diagram, and unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin, all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

**Examinations and Inspections:** Thursday, September 30, 2010, 8:00AM, there will be an In Barn Examination for all horses in the secured area to verify their identity, age, state of health, correctness of passport. At noon, for all competitors entered in FEI competitions horses will be examined to verify their fitness to compete. Location and procedure for the examination will be announced on the grounds. The Person Responsible for each horse must be present unless a written request has been approved by the FEI Veterinarian. If the rider is under 18, the committee must be given the name of the adult who shall be the Person Responsible.

**Equine Influenza Vaccination:** Vet. Regs. Annex VII - All horses and ponies for which an FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI, has been issued must have the vaccination section endorsed by a veterinarian, stating that it has received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza, given between 1 and 3 months apart. In addition, a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding 6 months, subsequent to the second injection of the primary vaccination. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding 7 days including the day of the competition or of the entry into the competition stables. The above are minimum requirements for influenza vaccination. Both primary and first and subsequent booster injections should be given according to the manufacturer's instructions which will fall within the stipulation of the FEI ruling.

**Sampling for Prohibited Substances:** Vet. Regs. Chap. V & VI and Annex IV - Regular sampling is carried out in CCI3\*/4\*, CSIs (3\*, 4\*, 5\*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. When testing takes place, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate; however, a minimum of three is recommended (VET Regs. Art 1016). Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI's Medical Control Program (Groups I and II only).

**ATTENTION COMPETITORS**

Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct association numbers (USDF, USEF) for horse, owner, rider and trainer, before the day(s) of the competition.

The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.

**THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT for the Welfare of the Horse**

1. The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) requires all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.
2. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
3. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
4. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
5. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.

The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

Insurance - All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

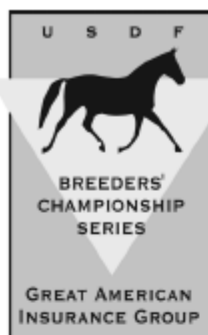

# 2010 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series



The Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series (USDFBC) is a program designed to promote breeders and showcase quality sport horses. Each series will consist of at least three qualifying events in designated geographical areas of the United States, which will lead to a final event in each series. Exhibitors compete at qualifying events for the champion and reserve champion current year foal, filly, colt/gelding, mare and stallion. These horses

are then invited to compete in each of their respective classes, in the final event of that series, which is where the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion current year foal, filly, colt/gelding, mare, and stallion will be determined.

For a list of events participating in the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series or the complete rules and guidelines, contact USDF at (859) 971-2277 or [www.usdf.org](http://www.usdf.org). A list of upcoming events is also included in the *USDF Connection*.

## Qualifying System

The USDFBC Series is scheduled on a calendar year basis (January 1-December 31).

A series must have a minimum of three qualifying events in order to hold a series final. All shows in the series, including qualifier classes held in conjunction with the final of the series, are qualifying events.

The final event of each series is normally the last USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized dressage competition holding DSHB classes scheduled in a particular geographical area of the United States as of July 1 of the year prior to the series final year. However, a series final may also be held at either a separate dressage or DSHB show which does not offer other DSHB classes, and is not a USDFBC qualifying event. Host sites of series finals will be designated on or about July 1 of the year prior to the series final.

If a USDFBC Series does not have at least three qualifying events registered with USDF by June 1 of the series final year, the final will not be held for that series.

Horses may compete in qualifying events in any series, but they may participate in only one final class. Horses must qualify in the series in which they enter the final. Exception: Horses that have qualified for a series final which is either not scheduled or is cancelled may participate in the final of any other USDFBC series in the same calendar year, without having to re-qualify for that series. Owners of horses that have qualified for a final which is not held, may enter another series final, but must indicate which series they qualified at on their entry form.

Series final events must allow late entries in the series final classes for horses that qualified for the series final event after the official closing date for the final event.

If there is a change of ownership of the horse, the new owner(s) may choose to participate in the series final where they reside, regardless of where they qualified, provided that the new owner contacts the USDF office and initiates the change at least 30 days prior to the new Series Final date. (BOG 12/08)

Each qualifying event must offer a current year foal class, a filly championship class, a colt/gelding championship class, a mare championship class and a stallion championship class. These classes are USDFBC qualifying classes. The champion and reserve champion in each of these classes, from each series qualifying event, are eligible to compete in their respective USDFBC series final class. A third place horse in each series qualifying championship class must be named as well. If the champion, reserve or both have already qualified for the series final class, the third place horse will also be invited to compete in the series final class. In addition, any other horse receiving a 77% or better in its age/sex class will be eligible to compete in the final class. A list of qualified horses is maintained by series on the USDF Web site.

## Current Year Foal Championship

The current year foal championship class at qualifying events must be open to first and second place winners of Sport Horse Prospect In Hand classes for all horses of current calendar year, as listed below. First and second place (and third if desired) fillies and colts/geldings of current year will compete against each other in the same class. (Organizers have the option of including third placed winners in championship classes.)

Fillies of current calendar year  
Colts/Geldings of current calendar year

## Filly and Colt/Gelding Championship

The Filly and Colt/Gelding Championship classes at qualifying events must be open to first and second place winners of Sport Horse Prospect In Hand classes for all horses as listed below. (Organizers have the option of including third placed winners in championship classes.)

<i>Filly Championship:</i>	<i>Colt/Gelding Championship:</i>

## Mare and Stallion Championship

The Mare and Stallion Championship classes at qualifying events must be open to first and second place winners of Breeding Stock In Hand classes for horses age four years old and over, as listed below. (Organizers have the option of including third placed winners in championship classes.)

*Mare Championship:*  
Mare classes may be divided by age, competition and/or breeding status, as in the following example:

Four-year old and older maiden mares – never bred  
Four-year old and older yield mares-never bred or not currently bred or nursing  
Four-year old and older broodmares – In foal or currently nursing (mare only to be judged).

For details on determining breeding status for competitor purposes, please refer to USEF DR203.16.

#### *Stallion Championship:*

Stallion classes may be divided by age, competition and/or breeding status, as in the following example:

- Four-year old and older stallions showing only in hand
- Four-year old and older stallions showing also under saddle

Age/sex eligibility is determined as follows:

- a. Fillies, colts and geldings three years of age or under may show ONLY as sport horse prospects, not in breeding stock classes/categories.
- b. Mares and stallions age four and over may show ONLY in breeding stock classes/categories.  
Note: Two and three-year olds are ONLY eligible to compete in the filly or colt championships. They are NOT eligible for the mare or stallion championships.
- c. Geldings of any age may NOT show in breeding stock classes/categories. Geldings age three and under may show ONLY in sport horse classes/categories.

No geldings may compete in the USDFBC classes for stallions even if they are gelded after qualifying for the finals and are breeding via frozen semen.

Horses and ponies of any origin may compete.

Horses participating in USDFBC qualifying or final events are not required to be registered with any studbook, but “if a horse is registered with any breed organization, the name of the breed, sire, dam, dam sire and breeder must be given on the entry blank. For unregistered horses competing in DSHB classes, the information is strongly recommended, if available.” (USEF GR907.1)

The USDFBC championship classes must be offered and judged at each qualifying event according to USEF DR209 and DR210. These championships may not be awarded on the basis of previous scores.

The champion and reserve champion in each championship class at a qualifying event will be presented with a qualifier ribbon. Only the champion and reserve champion will receive the qualifier ribbon, even if they have previously qualified. A third place horse in each championship class must be named as well, but will not receive a qualifier ribbon.

#### **Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying Events** (These are minimum requirements)

*Horse:* USDF Horse Identification (HID) number

*Owner:* USDF non-member (NM) number and fee

*Handler:* Exempt

USEF Membership is not required, but non-member fees apply.

#### **Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders’ Championship Series Final Events**

Five championship classes will be offered at a Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders’ Championship Series Final Event. These are: current year foal, filly, colt/gelding, mare and stallion. All champions and reserve champions in each of the five championship classes from each qualifying competition are eligible to participate in the Great American/USDF Breeders’ Championship Series Final Event. A grand champion and reserve grand champion current year foal, filly, colt/gelding, mare, and stallion will be named at each series final event.

At least two judges qualified to judge a Federation Licensed Dressage Sport Horse Breeding division (one of whom must be a licensed USEF DSHB judge) must officiate in each series final class. Each judge will evaluate each entry independently, and scribes must be provided for each judge. Winners will be determined by the average of all judges’ scores. The highest placed horse in each class will be declared grand champion and the second-highest placed horse will be declared reserve grand champion. Ties in USDFBC Finals classes must remain unbroken.

Horses must be shown individually on the triangle at the walk and trot and standing for conformation. Each horse must be evaluated in the same manner. DSHB sport horse prospects are evaluated on yellow score sheets; DSHB breeding stock horses are evaluated on pink score sheets. Call backs are permitted.

Grand champions and reserve grand champions will receive awards and prizes provided by USDF. Third through sixth-placed horses in the series final classes will receive ribbons. After the final event, special certificates will be available from USDF via the USDF web site to owners of all horses that compete in a series final class.

USDF reserves the right to change, alter, or retract any placings and/or prizes for up to 60 days after the last day of the championship if an error or violation is discovered, after which no changes will be made.

#### **Membership/Registration Requirements for Final Events**

*Horse:* USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR)

*Owner:* USDF Participating Membership (PM) or USDF Business Membership (BM)

*Handler:* Exempt

USEF Membership is not required, but non-member fees apply.

Verification of USDF Participating or Business membership and Lifetime Horse Registration must be provided to management prior to the series final class.

Please note that when qualifying classes are held prior to the final classes at the series final event, it is the exhibitor’s responsibility to apply for, or provide proof of, proper memberships and horse registrations to competition manager prior to the final class.

**USDF Membership Benefits:** USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the *USDF Directory* or the USDF Web site at [www.usdf.org](http://www.usdf.org).

**Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions:** Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership, Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF NM fee. (Note: USDF business members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership (BM).)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized shows must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, Pas de Deux, Quadrille, or FEI ParaEquestrian classes, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot and academy classes. For foreign-owned horses competing in a CDI, USDF accepts copies of the horse identification pages from an FEI passport in lieu of a USDF HID or Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) number.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

#### **Memberships Defined**

**Participating Membership (PM):** A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$62), 5-years (\$250), or life (\$1,000). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21<sup>st</sup> birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$35). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan<sup>®</sup>/USDF Year-End Awards, Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals, and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

**Group Membership (GM):** A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards program.

**Business Membership (BM):** A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$175) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

**Non-Member (NM) Identification Number:** For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$20 and a USDF NM form per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF member there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF Web site.

**Horse Identification (HID) Number:** A one-time tracking number for horses (\$20). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan<sup>®</sup>/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes or Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$65. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

**Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR):** A horse with an LHR (\$85) is eligible for Adequan<sup>®</sup>/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals and Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.
