New Rules Regarding Vaccines and Helmets Now in Effect

Two new rules affecting competitors went into effect as of 12/1/15. The first in the

vaccine rule, GR845.

"Effective 12/1/2015, horses entering the show grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within 6 months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the grounds upon request by Competition Management."

The second rule, DR206.6, requires helmets for **all** handlers, assistant handlers, and whip assistants **of any age** in in-hand classes at breed shows.
